## Tech Giants - Google and Amazon fined by CNIL

Concluding its ongoing investigation against Amazon and Google, the French data protection authority (CNIL) recently imposed a fine of EUR 35 million on Amazon Europe Core Sarl for cookie violations on its website amazon.fr. Similarly, two Google entities Google LLC and Google Ireland Limited were fined EUR 60 million and EUR 40 million respectively as they were held jointly liable for cookie violations on website google.fr.



## **Datinspektionen hands out GDPR fines**

Datinspektionen, the Swedish data protection authority, issued a fine of SEK 4 million on Stockholm's Board of Education for deficiencies in restricting user access to data of students on online platform.

The authority has recently also concluded its data protection audits and found that seven healthcare providers have not taken appropriate measures to demonstrate a sufficient level of security for the personal health data. Consequently, these entities were handed out fines, between SEK 2.5 to 30 million.





## **Spanish watchdog fined multiple entities**

Spanish data protection authority, AEPD sanctioned fines on Telefonica Moviles Espana and Miraclia Telecomunicaciones S.L of EUR 75,000 and EUR 40,000 respectively for processing of data unlawfully and violating provisions under GDPR. Furthermore, a fine of EUR 75,000 was imposed on EDP Comercializadora SA for processing personal data without the user's consent.



## Websites violating GDPR taken down in Belgium

The Belgium's data protection authority and DNS Belgium, the “.be” domain registry have entered into co-operation agreement allowing the DNS Belgium to take down those websites which are found in violation of the GDPR.
