## Cattle feed prices soar due to GST on pulses by-products

Cattle feed prices in the country have soared due to the levy of 5% GST on some by-products of pulses such as their supplements and husks. During the milling of pulses, a wide range of by-products such as chilka, khanda, and churi are obtained. The 5% GST is applicable on bran, sharps and other residues, whether or not in the form of pellets, derived from the sifting, milling or other working of cereals or of leguminous plants
